However, the authors do not explain how thy have applied the qualitative aspect in the processes, connecting with the specific contexts of the schools, the procedures of the generation, selection and interpretation of data. I suggest the authors revise the statement, below, in the Conclusion, as they do not bring any type of scientific source: ...the recruitment and retention of teachers in the remote and rural schools has become a challenge especially in the low-income countries due to the fact that these countries have severe shortages of competent teachers and large rural populations. A careful language revision is required throughout the article. Examples of these points: A number of school organizational factors play... ...important factors like living conditions including proper government housing and sanitation was Other factors like classroom environments, adequate support from Education offices and timely intervention from the government was found essential... selective number of teachers were included in the study... viewed as greatest challenge...
