(Konde.co and Magdalene.co) without describing the message as radical or moderate, telling these styles quantitatively alone, may be difficult to “show”. Perhaps, quantitative text analysis should be elaborated on why that is used and why descriptive survey is dropped.</p> <p>2 In the abstract, why the work is essential or important to be studied is not captured.</p> <p>3 In the introduction, “bot” is written instead of “both” in paragraph 5 line 10</p> <p>4 Let us consider a revision in paragraph 6 where “by” must be removed from in front of “heard”. Example: “media alternative makes women’s issues easier to be heard and disseminated...</p> <p>5 Reference “Tirto.id” lacks reference detail.
