Kindly give explanation for the accuracy of the questionnaire used to exclude patients with urgency or overactive bladder as sometimes patients present with mixed symptoms including both urgency and SUI. 2. Kindly clarify the term used-Important organ prolapse or pelvic organ prolapse in methods section. 3. Kindly give explanation for the term used as 'healthy controls' mentioned in table 1 and table 2. If patients have other conditions such as urgency or overactive bladder, can they be labelled as healthy controls?</p>
