Remember antimicrobials are not same as antibiotics. There is no where in the manuscript where antivirals, antiparasitic, antiprotozoan or antifungal drugs were mentioned despite the fact that they are antimicrobials. Since, the author (s) are dealing with AMR, then such drugs should at least be mentioned at least in the introduction. I know antibiotics are of major concern in AMR, but they are not they only antimicrobials causing AMR</p> <p>N.B. All the corrections were done directly inside the manuscript.
