However, I think its contribution to the literature is limited. It is known that data obtained from a university cannot be expected to represent the whole society or other universities. The title of the article is not compatible with its content. Yes Yes -They should explain in the method how they divided food literacy knowledge into dichotomies in logistic regression. -Need to explain RC footnote of tables. -The findings are mixed and difficult to understand, and there are discrepancies in statistical evaluations. -While there was a significant difference between men and women for food literacy in the logistic regression, the insignificant difference in the chi-square test should be explained. -The discussion is insufficient, literature information is lacking, a better literature review on the subject is required	 This is a pilot study among the elites to know their level of food literacy Gender-centric Assessment of Food Literacy among Staff of Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, Nigeria -This section has been re-written and explained to include the dichotomies of the food literacy skill set. -RC = Reference category The findings are now well rearranged and stated in detail.
