He presented with a left hilar mass and extensive metastasis to the spine and right hip, accompanied by symptoms of shortness of breath, cough, weight loss, and chest pain. His history included chronic smoking. Despite receiving chemotherapy, the patient died from acute complications. The report emphasizes the rarity and aggressive nature of SCLC, which accounts for 15% of lung cancers, and underscores the need for early diagnosis and aggressive treatment.
