Compulsory REVISION comments	<p>The article deals with an interesting topic that monitors the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic on household income and expenditure in a selected country. The strongest aspect of the paper is the results part based on statistical characteristics. The weakest aspect of the paper, on the other hand, is the theoretical part, the small number of resources used. I appreciate the novelty of the data sample used, but also the statistical support of the results, the use of statistical methods and a relatively detailed description of the results, the comparison between the period before and after the pandemic.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The information in the introduction and the research problem must be based on ideal quality sources, studies by other authors. It is necessary to add a section of Literature Review, which will describe further studies of the authors on the topic, you should use literature analysis to determine whether and how the topic is addressed in the world, what methods researchers use, which are beneficial and which are not. Your text is very poor and together it uses only 12 literary sources, of which only 4 are published in the last 5 years and 5 sources are older than 30 years, which is a really long time in today's turbulent times.2. From the methodological part, it is no longer clear how you collected the data (electronically, in person?), How did you address the respondents? Did each respondent respond to your form every month for two years? How did you motivate them?	<p>*Recent references have been used that dealt with the same topic of the article.</p> <p>1-done</p> <p>2- The data was collected using a questionnaire and personal interviews of the respondents</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The data of the questionnaire was collected to conduct a research on income and expenditure and its impact on the Egyptian family in 2019 with personal interviews and follow-up by phone every month, and the data collection was completed on December 31, 2019 and while commenting on the results, the Corona pandemic appeared and swept the world and affected the whole world, including Egypt, which This led to a change in the research method and the method for collecting data to include before and during the pandemic to serve the reality in the region. Imposing restrictions and precautionary measures by the state to limit the spread of the disease. The Corona pandemic came as a surprise to the members of the Egyptian society, which made him in a psychological situation worried about successive events, and he did not know their negative side effects until after comparing his spending and income during the pandemic to the previous year, and therefore it was an automatic catalyst.
Minor REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. In Part 4 of the Methodology and Data Sources, the title suggests that data sources should be addressed, but I do not see information about data sources in the text of this chapter. You only state this in Chapter 5.2. The figures presented in the results section are not completely in order, it would probably be better to present each figure separately with additional text and explanation.3. Finally, the limits of the research should also be defined, which can certainly include geographical restrictions, as your research is applied to only part of one state. You can also add suggestions for future research.4. It is a pity that you are addressing the recommendation to the Egyptian government, but not directly to households. It is very difficult to influence the government's decision, but it is possible to influence household income and expenditure in some way.
