There are many similar papers and hence I don't see much value addition to the extant literature except that the study nearly replicates the results of the earlier ones.</li><li>3. The author/s could have studied new variables/constructs (such as the source of knowledge for self-medication (is it peers or social media) and is self-medication common among all income groups, etc.) would have made the research valuable.</li><li>4. Besides the first two points, I don't see any deficiency/deficiencies in the manuscript and it can be published if the editor so wishes.</li></ol>	<p><b>The author have gone through the whole article meticulously and have corrected the grammatical errors.</b></p> <p>The article addresses a disturbing phenomenon observed on the University campus (the study setting), for which no previous documentation could be accessed. The data generated from this study will provide empirical basis for self medication problems among students; this will enable the university to take corrective steps in terms of health education and other measures that may be considered necessary.</p> <p>Suggestions on new areas/variables of self-medication are most highly appreciated; this should form our next level of study.</p>
