<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>1. <i>Bauhiinia variegata</i> L. (The scientific name of a species may be followed by the name of the person who first described it, usually abbreviated and in normal font (no italics or bold). Example: <i>Genipa americana</i> L.</p> <p>The genus and species must always be spelled out in full in the first citation in the text (article). Thereafter, the genus can be abbreviated, using the capital letter and the abbreviation period, as long as the specific epithet is extended. Example: <i>Bauhinia variegata</i> L. = <i>B. variegata</i> L.</p> <p>Note: Once the abbreviated form has been adopted, it should be continued like this until the end of the text. Therefore, one should avoid the oscillation between the full and abbreviated forms throughout the same text.</p> <p>2. Avoid repeating words from the Title of the article, put other words related to your article, this will increase the number of people reading your article, and will probably lead to more citations.</p> <p>4. In topics 6. (a); &amp; (a) and 8 (a) of the methodology: Inform the number of drops used, so that other researchers can test from this study.</p> <p>5. Reference: scientific name of species must be written in italics.</p> <p>4. Methodology: Insert complete information on the methodology used</p> <p>5. Discussion: Further discuss the results obtained in the study.</p> <p>6. Conclusion: Name in vitro and in vivo should be written in italics.</p> <p>7.
