Compulsory REVISION comments	 The usual definition for "senior" is older than 65 years old, which the authors also referred to in the introduction. However, in the following main text, this definition was not clear. Why did the authors choose the age cut off at 55? It could be useful for the readers to have some information about the demographic characteristics of South Asian caregivers in Canada, not only in this study Are the results specific to the South Asian caregivers community? Of are they perceptions from the whole caregivers group in Canada? The stigma is quite usual (cf last global survey from ADI) The general writing should be proofread by a native speaker. 	
Minor REVISION comments Optional/General comments	 Introduction, second paragraph: One in four Canadians are caregivers for their family members, and approximately 8 million caregivers (<15 years) provide care to family members or friends living with a chronic condition and health problems related to older age. I don't understand what means 15 years. In the next sentence, there is also a need to define the age cutoff for "senior" Among these caregivers, about 3.8 million are senior informal caregivers (>45 years) who provide care for senior-family members and friends. Usually, "senior" means older than 65 years old. Methods: the thematic analysis method for the qualitative study should be cited with a reference
