<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. The introduction part appears like reading a book on tibial hemimelia. The author fails to justify the title . The research question “ Challenges in management in a resource constrained region”need to be emphasized more elaborative.</li><li>2. Challenges in resource constrained regions like socioeconomic status, parental education, etc. in an available scale can be used for objectifying the data.</li><li>3. Authors description about 1<sup>st</sup> case: Absent of Limb length discrepancy is very unlikely happened in Type Ia tibial hemimelia as two limbs can never be similar. Presence of associated Radial club hand in that patient needs special discussion as overall prosthetic rehabilitation in future require a reasonable fair hand function for use of walking aids with bilateral prosthesis.</li></ol>	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. What type of rehabilitation management done because of constrained in resources need to be explained.</li><li>2. Needs some language correction in the manuscript.</li></ol>
