It looks like a comparison here. Higher was appropriate when comparing the male and female students.</p> <p>Last line: can we use another word instead of menace. 'in the Nigeria the university' – this does not sound grammatically correct.</p> <p>Introduction:</p> <p>Second sentence: Cite it (Shire NJ, Rouster SD, Rajicic N, et al. This is called plagiarism</p> <p><b>METHODOLOGY</b></p> <p>Can we have some graphs to represent our tables, it would be easy to follow.</p> <p><b>DISCUSSION</b></p> <p>This section needs to be enriched. There are a lot of studies on this topic that have been carried out in the continent. Please search for more studies.</p> <p><b>CONCLUSION</b></p> <p>Please add other risk factors apart from age that you found in your results.</p> <p><b>REFERENCE</b></p> <p>Use a reference software manager.
