Compulsory REVISION comments	<p>The topic has been relevant worldwide for more than 2 years in connection with the COVID 19 pandemic, but this study is rather important at the local level and the results will be of value to the local school, the region.</p> <p>Methodology - the methodology of the quantitative study was explained in several places, but there is also a reference to the incomprehensible interviews .. structured questionnaire that was electronically distributed ..</p> <p>Results - it cannot be accepted that the percentages of knowledge acquired at school are very high, rather satisfactory. <i>A large percentage across the groups admitted having heard about it from school (clinical - 61.1%, MD - 57.7%, Nursing - 68.2% .. =</i></p> <p>The numbering of the tables is not clear.</p> <p>It should be reviewed whether all the tasks were able to clarify the answers and the hypothesis.</p> <p>General data was also requested, but is currently undescribed.</p>	
Minor REVISION comments	<p>Introduction - Modify wording “:: <i>among healthcare providers is low (1,4) and medical students (5).</i></p> <p>In recent years, hand washing has been such a topical issue that it is strange to even ask it. <i>Heard of hand hygiene practices</i></p> <p>The difference in the answers could be further explained e.g. ...<i>Notice boards remind me of hand hygiene ..</i></p> <p>All references to the sources in the list are in the work, but the references are changed according to the requirements of the journal, there are also typos</p>
