Compulsory REVISION comments	General Comments: The authors of the paper have studied nocturnal enuresis (NE) among schoolchildren in both a rural and an urban part of Egypt. A huge number of subjects (n= 65045) have answered questionnaires regarding demographic, familial factors, and criteria of NE in the population studied. The purpose has been to measure the prevalence of NE and the relation between NE and socioeconomic factors. The study comprised 1085 patients with NE. The prevalence of NE was 13.9 %. The occurrence of NE was related to several different factors. The statistical analyses seem to be performed correctly. However, the paper has several problems, of which some are mentioned under specific comments. Specific Comments: 1. The questionnaire is not available. The reader cannot evaluate the questions. In addition, the circumstances are not described for the procedure for response to the questionnaire. The authors refer to 'Appendix 1', but it is not enclosed with the paper. 2. There are many repeats in the paper. Thus, at the end of Introduction, the aim is given twice. Several others examples exist, but it is difficult to refer to specific parts of a manuscript, which have no pagination. 3. The tables are informative and clear. The text in Results is very difficult to read. Most of it should be rephrased and the most important points from the tables should be stressed in the text. 4. In Discussion, the results are repeated to a large extent. It is correct to refer to others results, but there is no explanation regarding discrepancies to results from other studies, and the authors do not interpret the importance of their data. Thus, what should be the consequences of the study? What are the advices to the health care authorities? 5. In Introduction, the authors correctly mention the classification of NE in primary and secondary cases. It is understood that this classifation is extremely important when you want to evaluate socio-economic factors contribution to the disease. A much more relevant approach to the study would
